



HACKLEY LIBRARY'S LOCAL HISTORY AND GENEALOGY Monumental History in Hackley Park

Shiloh, Antietam, Gettysburg – many miles separate the forests, fields, and hills of Michigan from these well-known battlefields of the Civil War. Even so, more than 90,000 Michigan soldiers served in the Union Army – nearly a quarter of the male population of the state in 1860. At the outset of the war, Michigan was asked to send four regiments; a flood of volunteers ensured that seven full regiments were mustered.

While there are several monuments to those who served in the Civil War in the Muskegon area, one of the most prominent is the Soldiers and Sailors Monument in Hackley Park. Dedicated on Memorial Day, May 30, 1892, this 76-foot tall memorial to those who fought and died for the Union was gifted to the city by Charles Hackley. The surrounding park also contains several other statues and monuments commemorating other leading figures of the War.

Hackley Library's Local History and Genealogy Department maintains a rich collection of materials documenting those who served in the Civil War. One of the best is the <u>Record of Service of Michigan Volunteers in</u> <u>the Civil War, 1861-1865</u>, a 46-volume set representing the most complete record of Michigan soldiers and sailors available. We also hold a number of materials focusing on specific regiments from around Michigan, records from local chapters of the Grand Army of the Republic, directories of veteran burials in the county, and much more! In addition to our in-house materials, numerous records of soldiers from around the country can be found on the library's subscription websites, such as Ancestry Library Edition. Stop in at the Torrent House and check out our collection, Tuesday through Saturday, 10 AM - 5 PM!

The Record of Service of Michigan Volunteers in the Civil War, 1861-1865 is a valuable resource for researchers.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

If you have a Hackley Library card, you can use it to check out and borrow materials from any library within the cooperative. Alternatively, if you have a library card from another library within the cooperative, even extending outside of Muskegon County, you can use your library card to borrow items from Hackley Public Library!

HOW MANY PUBLIC LIBRARIES ARE THERE IN MUSKEGON COUNTY?

In addition to Hackley Public Library, there is also Muskegon Area District Library, Fruitport District Library, and White Lake Community Library.

WHAT LIBRARIES ARE IN THE COOPERATIVE THAT EXTEND OUTSIDE OF MUSKEGON COUNTY?

There are SO many! The Lakeland Library Cooperative serves 42 public libraries in Allegan, Barry, Ionia, Kent, Montcalm, Muskegon, Newaygo, and Ottawa counties.

HOW DOES THIS IMPROVE YOUR LIBRARY EXPERIENCE?

You can use your library card to check out materials from any of these libraries, whether that means going to a library and borrowing an item, or placing a hold on an item and having it sent to your home library.

You can also return your items to any of these libraries, and we'll make sure it gets safely back to the owning library!
