

Local History & Genealogy Department

Did you know our Local History & Genealogy Department has a complete collection of all known Muskegon City Directories? More than just phone books, city directories are vital resources for researching family, business, and property histories. Looking up a name can give you a person's occupation, the length of time they've resided at that address, and sometimes even the value of the property! Later directories provide even more useful information, including a section




HPL's Local History & Genealogy Department offers extensive resources for researching community and local history, discovering family roots and ancestry, and so much more.

organized by address rather than name. Looking for the first appearance of an address can be useful in estimating the year a home was built, or when a business was first established.

Most later directories were published annually, making them a great resource for finding information on individuals and organizations between the decennial censuses. The first directory was published in 1873 by A. Bailey, while the R.L. Polk Company was almost exclusively responsible for the preparation of later directories. Polk City Directories continue to be

published to this day - the most recent directory can be found at the Hackley Library's main building, while all older directories are located in HPL's Local History & Genealogy Department at the Torrent House. Stop in Tuesday through Saturday, 10 AM - 5 PM, and see what you can find in our Muskegon City Directories!
