


LEAP DAY CRAFTERNOON

DIRECTOR'S CORNER

I am pleased to provide a brief update on the remarkable progress of our Torrent House building project. Our dedicated team has successfully completed a thorough research project to understand our community's needs better, employing various methods, including surveys, interviews, and information-gathering sessions.

We distributed a survey to various libraries and nonusers. We organized four information-gathering sessions involving the Friends of the Library, library staff, board members, neighborhood associations, and other community members. The valuable insights collected from these efforts have been meticulously compiled into a wellorganized report, serving as the foundation for establishing goals to renovate the Torrent House.

While we are not yet ready to unveil the specific plans, I am confident you will be thrilled to learn about the exciting developments we have in store for the Torrent House. The following steps involve finalizing the plans and developing a detailed building plan to assess anticipated costs.

Once the building plan is in place, we will initiate a feasibility study to determine how much we can raise for the project. Subsequently, we will adjust our plans based on the feasibility findings before embarking on the fundraising process.

We sincerely appreciate your continued support and enthusiasm for this project. Your involvement is vital as we work towards enhancing our community space. Stay tuned for further updates on our journey.
